Part Two: Answer the questions for each novel

Antigone

- 1) Plot – Antigone wants to bury her brother and she is punished for this.
- 2) Antigone's uncle is named Creon
- 3) Antigone is the 3rd installment of the Oedipus myth.

Julius Caesar

- 1) Themes: Betrayal, Guilt, Friendship, Pride
- 2) Who is Caesar's wife? Calpurnia
- 3) When the Soothsayer says "beware the ides of March" this is an example of what literary element? Foreshadowing
- 4) How is Brutus a tragic hero? A tragic hero is a character that ends in destruction or a downfall. Brutus feels so guilty about killing his friend Caesar that he wants to die the same way Caesar dies. He commits suicide for his guilt.

Uncle Tom's Cabin

- 1) Define allegory – representation of an abstract or spiritual meaning
- 2) Who represents Jesus and his last days? Tom
- 3) What is the Fugitive Slave Act? African Americans in the North being taken back South in order to work at slaves. This divided the country because citizens were responsible for doing this.
- 4) Who is opposed to the Fugitive Slave Act and compares its cruelty to the bible? Mrs. Bird
- 5) Name two types of symbolism from the novel – Tom symbolizes Jesus and Legree symbolizes Satan

Separate Peace

- 1) Where is Devon located? New Hampshire

2) What was the meaning of Gene wearing Finny's pink shirt after the accident? **Gene wants to be like Finny. He felt good wearing Finny's clothes. This also comes into play when Gene has to start "living his life for Finny."**

3) Why does Gene push Finny out of the tree? **Envy and Jealousy. Gene did not feel as though he was as good as Finny.**

Paragraph: Throughout the year we have discussed many themes. Most of these themes are reoccurring. Write a paragraph in which you define theme and choose two reoccurring themes that we have discussed this year.

There are many themes we have talked about over and over again throughout the year.
